Handicaps

All junior members playing 18 holes are entitled to an official AGU or WGA handicap. This can be obtained by submitting (boys) 3 single 18 hole cards, (girls) 3 single 18 hole cards to the club handicapper Mrs May Scott-Morris. Juniors playing 3, 6 and 9 holes will be allocated a handicap by the Junior Co-ordinator in accordance with the system recommended by the NQGA. Any queries about handicapping should be referred to the Junior Co-ordinator.



What To Wear

Boys

Shirts must have a collar and must be tucked in – no football jerseys or beachwear. Slacks or Shorts – no beach, lycra or knitted stretch fabric. Socks above ankles. Covered shoes that don't damage the greens.

Girls

Tailored skirts, divided skirts, Skorts, Bermuda shorts, pedal pushers or slacks are acceptable – no lycra, stretch fabric or short tennis skirts. Tops must have a collar – no beach tops. Covered shoes that don't damage the greens.

Club Shirts

Club Shirts are available to be ordered at different times of the year due to sponsorship funding subsidy. Please ask at any time when the next order is being compiled.

Playing the Game

Golf Etiquette



The enjoyment of golf depends on the co-operation, consideration and courtesy exhibited by players.

Please help newcomers to understand and appreciate these unwritten but common sense rules.

1 x parent/caddie is recommended per player only and parents are requested not to smoke except in designated area's on the course around children & please limit advice but give unlimited encouragement.

The NQ Junior Code of Conduct must be read and signed by the player and guardian at the commencement of the competition year.

- Make sure you won't hit anyone before you have a practice swing.
- Wait until you won't hit up on players in front.
- Don't waste time between shots and be ready to play when it's your shot.
- If you fall behind, ask faster groups to play through.
- Smooth out bunkers after playing a shot, leave the rake as far away from the sloping edge of the bunker as possible, with the handle pointing down the fairway (ie towards the tee).
- Replace your divot sand repair the turf if damaged by your shot or practice swing. Fill over the replaced divot with sand.
- Repair your pitch mark on the green. Tap down spike marks around the hole after all players in your group have holed out.
- Take care not to damage the green with spikes, by leaning on your club or with flagstick.
- When putting, leave your buggy at the side of the green towards the next tee, not in front of the green. Leave the green without delay when your group has finished putting.
- Take care where you stand while a fellow player is playing their shot. Stand well out of their peripheral vision, and don't move or talk.

What does it cost?

- 3-hole players pay a membership fee of \$15.00 which is collected, registered by the junior club. No green fees are to be charged but competition fees of \$4.00 are collected and used as they play.
- 6-hole players pay a membership fee of \$20.00 which is collected, registered by the junior club. Green fees of \$3.00 are to be collected and receipted back to the main club. Competition fees of \$4.00 are collected and used as they play.
- 9-hole players pay a membership fee of \$50.00 which is collected, registered by the junior club. Green fees of \$4.00 are to be collected and receipted back to the main club. Competition fees of \$4.00 are collected and used as they play. (optional bulk green fees available at \$160.00)
- 18-hole players pay a membership fee of \$100.00 + GL/Affil/Ins fee of \$50.00 which is collected, registered and retained by the senior club. Green fees of \$5.00 are to be collected and receipted back to the main club. Competition fees of \$5.00 are collected and used as they play. (optional bulk green fee available at \$200.00)

- If an 18-hole junior comes from another club a nomination fee of \$33 is required to be paid. If a junior comes up through the current divisions within the club and is able to receive an AGU or WGA handicap then the nomination fee is waived.
- All juniors reaching 18 years of age will finish all junior competitions. An invoice will be sent out from the club to invite them to pay the gap in fees to bring them up to an intermediate member.
- All fees listed are subject to an annual review.

Know the Rules

When you play in competition, you play by the Rules of Golf issued by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, and also any local rules on the scorecard, handed out for a game, or on the notice board.

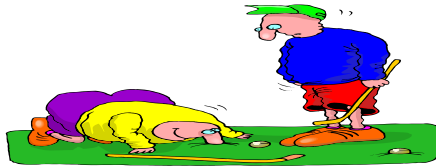
Always remember to check your handicap before you play.

Remember to read the Local Rules before you play.

(on white board outside start box)

Rules books are available free of charge from the starters box.

Juniors should carry their membership cards at all times and produce them if requested.



Conditions

1. Junior members will be made fully aware of the rules of golf and will be expected to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the etiquette of golf.
2. All junior events will be drawn events.
3. Any displays of temperament with reference to the drawing of partners for play will result in automatic debarring from the competition of the day.

General

1. Junior members are expected to show due respect to all adult members of the club and should not address them by their given name or nick-name unless invited to do so by the member.
2. Juniors must abide by the clubs dress standards at all times.
3. Any unseemly behavior such as bad language, equipment abuse etc, will be subject of a report to the Club's management committee and could result in suspension from the Club.
4. A junior player will become eligible for a WGA or an AGU handicap, when, in the opinion of the junior Coordinator, he or she has a full understanding of the rules and scoring systems of golf. 9-hole players must complete a rules seminar and pass the written exam before progressing to 18-holes.
5. At the beginning of each playing season a Junior Committee will be elected to assist the Junior Club so as to provide the junior members with the opportunity to gain experience in the running of a sporting club as well as playing the game.

Adult Competitions

- All 18-hole junior players are eligible to play in all senior competitions (including opened & closed championships). They can enter their name on the time sheet for Saturday morning field 1 week prior, however they can only play in the Saturday afternoon field if vacancies are available on the Friday afternoon prior. A maximum of 3 juniors are allowed in the senior competition but must have 1 adult/intermediate player in the group.
- All 18-hole players wishing to play in the senior completion are to pay competition & green fees at current senior scheduled rate.
- All 18-hole players are required to compete in 75% of junior competitions available to be eligible to compete in major junior events such as Junior Club Championships.

Club Representation

Representing your club is a privilege to be enjoyed and should not be abused or taken for granted. Whenever you are playing at other clubs, in juniors or senior events, you are representing your club. You should record your home club and membership number on your scorecard.

Each year two teams of 18-hole players with current AGU & WGA handicaps are selected by the Junior Coordinating committee to represent the club in Junior Handicap Pennant competition in either Ayr or Proserpine.

At the end of July a nomination form will be handed out and will close at the end of August.

To be considered for selection you must:

1. Have played a minimum of 5 junior club competitions.
2. Players need to be playing around their current handicap level.
3. Players need to be of good character and display good golfing etiquette at all times.
4. Age may be a consideration for selection.

Match Play

All 18-hole junior members who support junior golf and have entered two or more junior competitions before the 14th of March will be placed in a draw to play handicap match play. Matches will be played on the days allotted otherwise will be forfeited. Amendments to match day will be confirmed by junior committee.

1st Round will be on the 18/03/12

2nd Round will be on the 25/03/12

3rd Round to will be on the 1/04/12

Final Round to will be on the 29/04/12

A perpetual Trophy for the Match Play Champion will be presented on presentation day.

Sunday Competition

3, 6, 9 and 18-hole competition is available for all levels. All players and intending players should have completed a coaching clinic and been recommended to play in junior competition by the coaching staff. Parents must be available to walk with their child if playing 3, 6 or 9-hole competitions. After 3 competition games it would be expected that all players have paid their membership fee.

Putting Competition

This separate competition will run for the duration of the year with monthly winners receiving a small prize in each grade. For 18-hole players, your putts need to be written in the highlighted column provided. For 9 – 6 – 3 players, your putts will be written on walk sheets after each hole. You are putting when you are on the green only.

Monthly Medal Competition

Each month on a specified date all players in each division have the opportunity to play for the title of “Monthly Medal Winner” for that month. At the end of the season all winners of this title from previous months will play off against each other to become the champion for the year in separate divisions and will collect a trophy on presentation closing day. If you win a medal when you are in 6-holes for example and then go up to 9-holes later in the year, you are then competing for the 9-hole monthly medal champion title in the finals.

When moving from 9-holes up to 18-holes, players are unable to win a monthly medal competition until being allocated an official AGU or WGA handicap by the club handicap manager. Boys need to enter 3 x 18-hole cards and girls need to enter 3 x 18-hole cards.

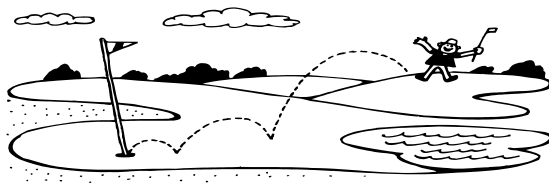
